

Challenge for the More Able

Provision for the 'More Able' is multifaceted and each school will have its own policy and programme of support in place or under development. Common to all will be the most fundamental part - provision within the classroom. Regardless of whatever else is happening in the school, effective whole-school provision for the 'more able' is dependent on each individual teacher leading the learning within their own classroom, and every teacher has the power to influence the learning experience of the 'more able' students in their care.

Any teaching staff from both primary or secondary level.

Course content

This session is focused on providing for 'More Able' students, or those with 'High Learning Potential (HLP)', on an everyday basis, in the classroom.

After examining the profiles and particular needs of children with High Learning Potential, we will explore strategies, techniques and activities that could be used to provide challenging learning opportunities for these, and other, students.
