Objectives

- Gain a thorough understanding of the needs of children with High Learning Potential
- Develop increased understanding of how to identify children with HLP
- Establish a way forward for your school recognising its uniqueness and the particular needs of your school.
- Identify sources of specialist information and support for schools, teachers, parents and HLP children.
- Consider implications for further staff development on the subject.
