

Teaching grammar with children's literature

Monday 10th February 2020, 9am - 12:30pm, Ashmount School

This course aims to bring grammar alive by demonstrating how grammatical techniques are used in authentic children's texts.

Experienced trainer and education writer, Rachel Clarke, takes participants on a trip through her personal library as she demonstrates how the grammar taught in KS1 and KS2 is used by experienced children's writers.

This is a highly practical course and one that aims to inspire teachers to make connections between the requirements of the national curriculum for grammar and a love of high-quality children's literature.
